

Your journey to one of the world's most iconic wonders begins with the excitement of sunrise in Cusco. The day start with an early morning pick-up from your hotel in Cusco. The route takes you through the heart of the Sacred Valley, a fertile and sacred land that still holds the energy of its ancient inhabitants. A unique journey begins at Ollantaytambo, a train station nestled among the mountains: the train to Aguas Calientes, the gateway to the Historic Sanctuary of Machu Picchu.




The train ride is an experience in itself.

As you advance, the landscape transforms before your eyes: from open valleys to dense cloud forests that embrace the Urubamba River. Each curve presents natural landscapes that prepare you emotionally for what lies ahead. It's a leisurely journey, ideal for letting yourself be absorbed by the surroundings and beginning to imagine the majesty of the Inca citadel. This beautiful and comfortable tour will accompany you until you reach Aguas Calientes.

Once in Aguas Calientes, one of our friendly hotel staff will be there to greet you and take you straight to your accommodation. The rest of your day is entirely yours to spend however you wish. You might want to relax at your hotel, or perhaps head out to explore the town. Many visitors enjoy a trip to the local hot springs (just so you know, the entrance fee for this activity is not included).


DAY 02

MACHU PICCHU – CUSCO

An unforgettable day in Machu Picchu

After an early breakfast at the hotel, we board the CONSETUR tourist bus, which will take us on a scenic 30-minute ride to the majestic citadel of Machu Picchu, one of the New Seven Wonders of the World.

The town is very tiny, and the signs there will tell you where to go to catch the bus. Your guide, or our staff, will be there to assist you if you have doubts or feel lost. Along the way, you'll enjoy spectacular views of the Urubamba Canyon, surrounded by mist-covered mountains.



Upon your arrival, our expert guide will show you the Machu Picchu sanctuary for approximately 3 hours. Our guide will tell you the secrets of this ancient citadel.

You'll explore its main sectors, including the Temple of the Sun, the Sacred Plaza, the Intihuatana, and the agricultural terraces, while taking in the grandeur of this Andean legacy nestled among the mountains. After the guided tour, you'll have approximately 20 minutes to explore on your own and take fantastic photos of the breathtaking surroundings and the classic picture (only available with circuits 1 or 2).

After the visit, you will take the bus back down to Aguas Calientes, where you'll have free time to enjoy lunch at one of its charming restaurants (not included), shop for souvenirs, or simply relax by the river. Later, you will take the train to Ollantaytambo and enjoy landscapes.

Once in Ollantaytambo, our private transport will be waiting to take us back to Cusco, where you will arrive in the evening with incredible memories of your trip.

➤ **WHAT'S THE WEATHER LIKE IN CUSCO AND MACHU PICCHU?**

Cusco tends to be cooler, with temperatures typically ranging from 5°C to 18°C (41°F to 64°F), especially in the mornings and evenings. Machu Picchu is warmer and more humid, with daytime temperatures ranging from 15°C to 25°C (59°F to 77°F). Rain is most common from November to March.



QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS



➤ HOW LONG WILL I BE AT MACHU PICCHU?

You'll have approximately two hours for your guided tour, plus some extra time to explore on your own, depending on the train schedules.

➤ WHEN IS THE BEST TIME TO GO?

The dry season, from April to October, generally offers clearer weather and is considered the best time to visit. Keep in mind this is also high season, so early booking is key!

➤ IS PICK-UP AVAILABLE FROM AIRBNBS?

Yes, we offer pick-up from most Airbnbs located in central Cusco. If your accommodation is on a narrow street or a bit outside the center, we'll simply coordinate a convenient meeting point nearby.




➤ HOW FAR IN ADVANCE SHOULD I BOOK THIS TRIP?

We recommend booking as soon as your travel dates are firm. For most of the year, 2-3 months in advance is usually enough. However, during the high season (April to September), we strongly suggest booking 4-5 months ahead due to limited ticket availability.

WHAT TO BRING?

- **ORIGINAL PHYSICAL PASSPORT (MANDATORY) – Photocopies or digital versions are not accepted.**
- Comfortable walking shoes or sneakers.
- Cash (preferably in small bills) for personal expenses.
- Hat or cap for sun protection.
- Light raincoat or poncho (especially during the rainy season: November to March).
- Sunscreen (essential during the dry season: April to October).
- Plastic bags to protect electronics and personal items.
- Ecological water bottle or canteen.
- Camera, phone, and chargers.
Insect repellent.
- Personal medications and basic personal care items.
- Change of clothes for the second day.



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
