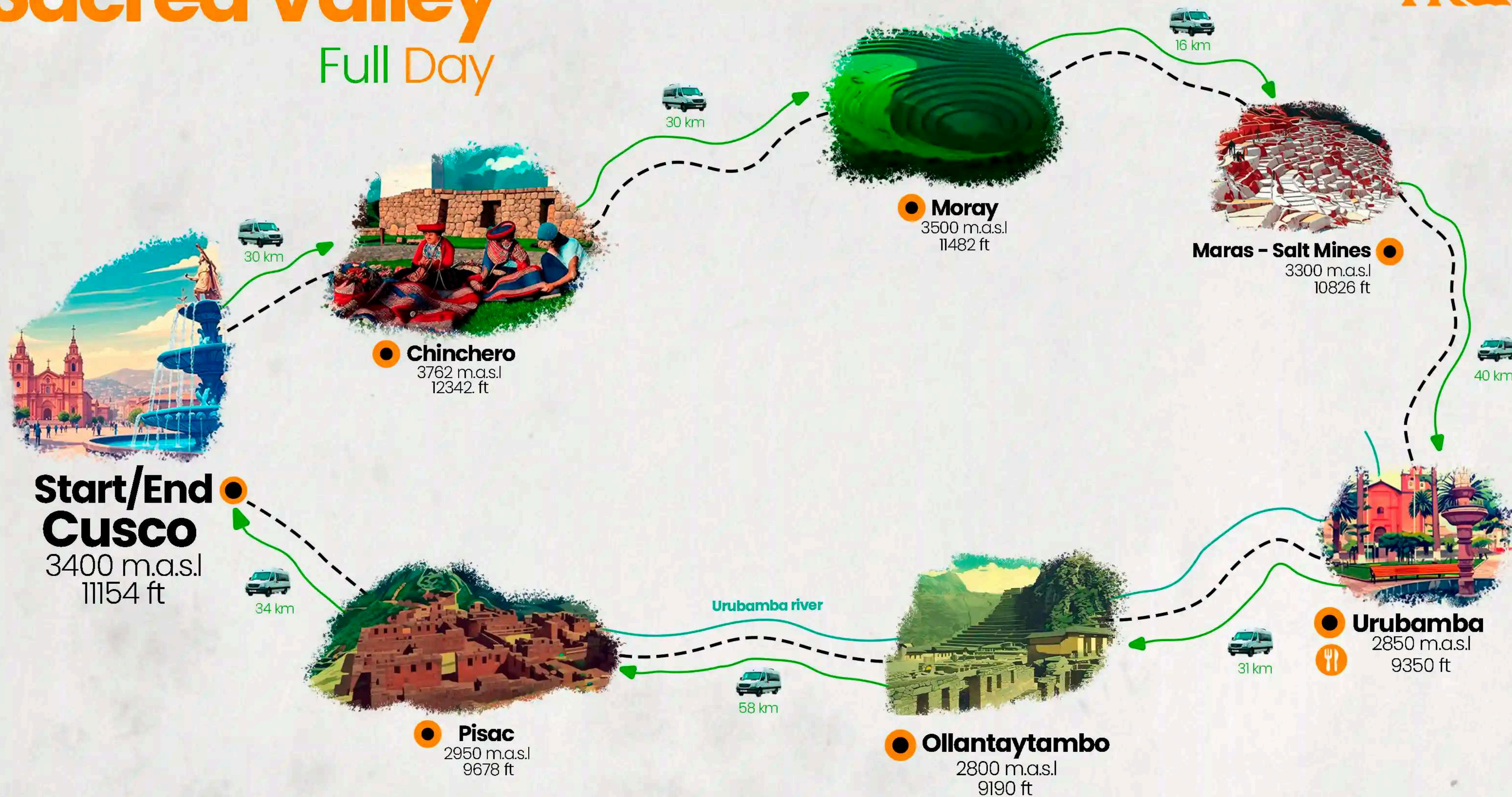

CUSCO – CHINCHERO – MORAY – MARAS –

A cradle of mysteries and wonders, the Sacred Valley defies time and logic

Walk the ancestral trails once traveled by Incas is a way to honor the living history of the Andes.

These of the Sacred Valley were not only created to travel long distances, but also to traverse dimensions of wisdom and spirituality. The experience of walking them awakens a sense of profound respect and allows each visitor to feel part of a legacy that lives on in every stone, every step, and every summit reached.



Embark on a journey that blends culture, breathtaking landscapes, and a reconnection with the essentials. From the very beginning, this trip through the Sacred Valley of the Incas invites you to immerse yourself in the living history of the Andes.

Cusco - Chinchero

Your day begins with hotel pick-up in Cusco between 6:45 - 7:00 AM approximately. From there, we drive to the highland town of Chinchero.

Chinchero will be your first stop; in this cultural town you'll witness the ancestral wisdom of the women weavers who still preserve ancient techniques of natural dyeing and weaving, while the Inca architecture and the colonial church envelop you in a story where the past continues to beat. At the archaeological site, you'll explore ancient walls and learn about the town's importance during the Inca Empire. You will visit a textile workshop to see how old weaving ways are still used.



Moray

Moray will be the second destination. Visiting the impressive circular terraces of Moray, you'll experience the ingenuity and spirituality with which the Incas worked the land. You will see the round farm terraces carved into the earth. These concentric platforms likely served as a kind of open-air agricultural lab, where different temperatures and microclimates helped the Incas experiment with crops.



Maras Salt Mines

Nearby, the Maras Salt Mines offer a visual spectacle: thousands of white pools gleaming in the sun, like a gift from the Apus. Here you will have the opportunity to learn how artisanal salt is made using techniques passed down from generation to generation. Used since pre-Inca times, these pools are still worked by local families who harvest salt by hand.



Lunch in Urubamba

Around lunch time we will stop in Urubamba, in Urubamba you will enjoy an delicious buffet lunch, brimming with authentic flavors that combine local ingredients with peruvian gastronomy. This is a great moment to relax and sample a variety of Peruvian dishes, with plenty of options for all dietary preferences.

Ollantaytambo

After the delicious lunch, you will visit the Ollantaytambo fortress, an emblematic structure that reflects the sophistication of the Inca civilization. Built by the Inca Pachacutec in the 15th century, this fortress served as both a temple and a military bastion. This archaeological complex was once a royal estate and a stronghold during the spanish conquest. Climb the ancient terraces and enjoy panoramic views of the Sacred Valley.

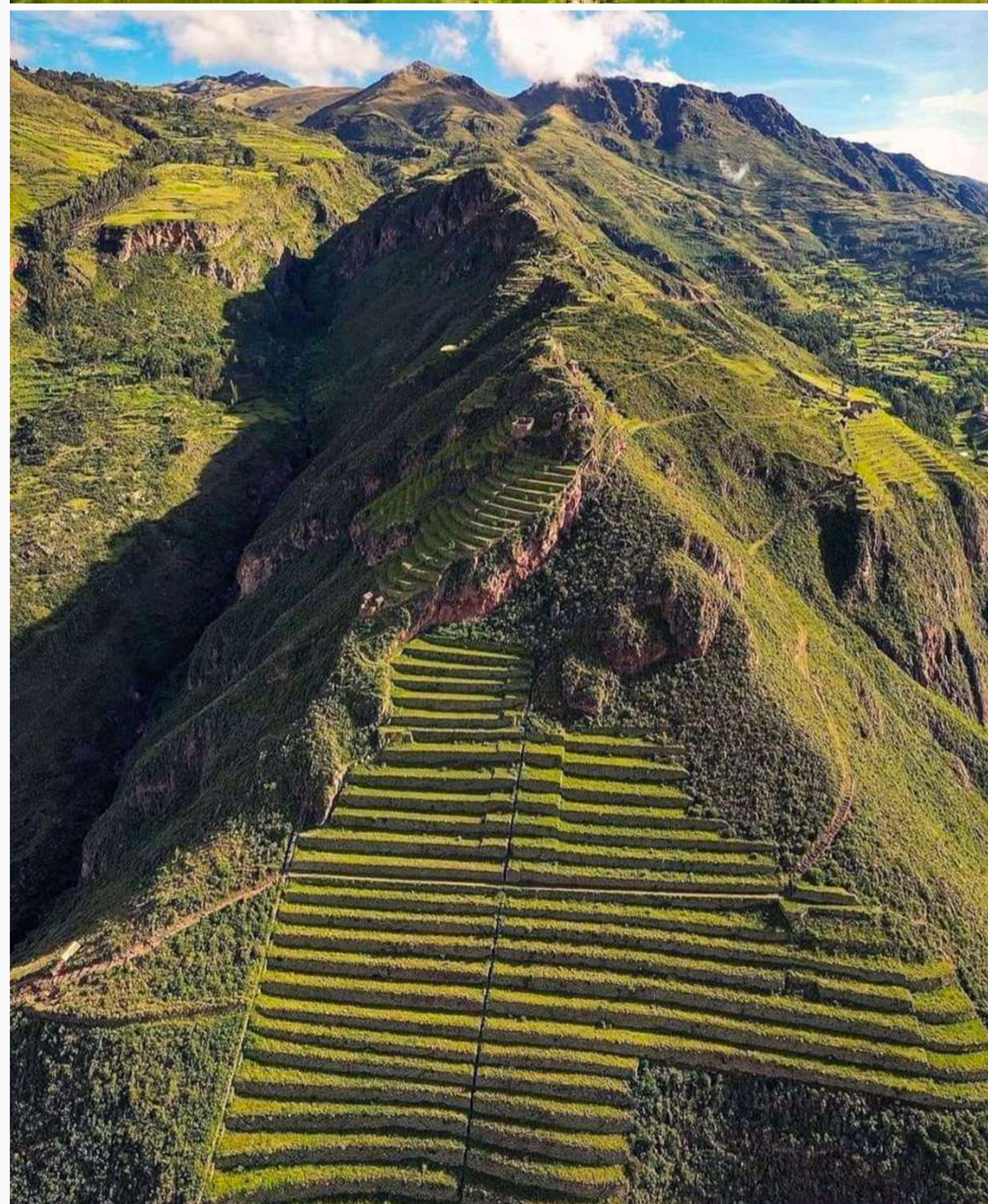


Pisac Archeological Site

Fuel your energy in one of the most impressive archaeological sites in the Sacred Valley: Pisac. This mountaintop complex invites you to discover the secrets of Inca architecture and agriculture while admiring perfectly laid-out terraces, ceremonial fountains, and finely carved stone temples. It's one of the most important sites in the valley and offers sweeping views of the surrounding mountains and river.

You will be able to walk through this place connects you with the ancestral wisdom of a civilization who knew how to live harmoniously with nature.

In addition to its archaeological value, Pisac offers a privileged view of the river and the surrounding Andean valleys.. This is more than a visit; it's a deep immersion in the Andean worldview.



Return to Cusco

After visiting Pisac, you will begin your return to Cusco. Our expert driver will take you back to Cusco in our private tourist transport. You will arrive at your hotel around 7:30 PM.

At the end of the day, you will return to Cusco with your heart full of stories, lessons learned, and memorable landscapes.

➤ **HOW LONG IS THE TOUR?**

The tour lasts a full day—approximately 12 hours. It starts with pickup at 6:45 – 7:00 AM and finishes with your return to Cusco around 7:30 PM.

➤ **ARE ENTRANCE TICKETS INCLUDED?**

Yes. The Tourist Ticket (Boleto Turístico Parcial), which gives you access to Chinchero, Moray, Ollantaytambo, and Pisac, is included. Entrance to the Maras Salt Mines is also included.

➤ **DO I NEED TO BRING MY ORIGINAL PASSPORT?**

Yes, your original passport or ID is required to validate entrance tickets at some sites and for identification purposes.

➤ **IS LUNCH INCLUDED?**

Yes. A buffet lunch in Urubamba is included in the tour.

➤ **IS THIS TOUR SUITABLE FOR CHILDREN OR OLDER ADULTS?**

Yes, it is suitable for travelers of all ages. The walking at the archaeological sites is generally moderate, with time for rest. If you have any mobility issues, please let us know in advance.

➤ **WHAT SHOULD I WEAR?**

Comfortable walking shoes, a hat or cap, sunscreen, a warm jacket for the afternoon, and a rain jacket if traveling during the rainy season (November to March).



QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

➤ HOW PHYSICALLY DEMANDING IS THE TOUR?

The tour involves moderate walking at archaeological sites, often on uneven or stepped paths. You don't need to be especially fit to enjoy the tour, but due to the altitude (up to 3,500 m / 11,482 ft), we recommend checking with your doctor if you have any medical conditions or concerns about high altitudes.

➤ WHAT'S THE BEST TIME OF YEAR TO DO THIS TOUR?

The tour operates year-round. The dry season (April to October) is ideal for clearer skies and dry trails. The rainy season (November to March) brings lush scenery but occasional rain showers.



➤ CAN I BUY SOUVENIRS DURING THE TOUR?

Yes, several stops offer opportunities to buy handmade textiles, ceramics, and souvenirs from local artisans. Bring cash in small bills (Peruvian soles).

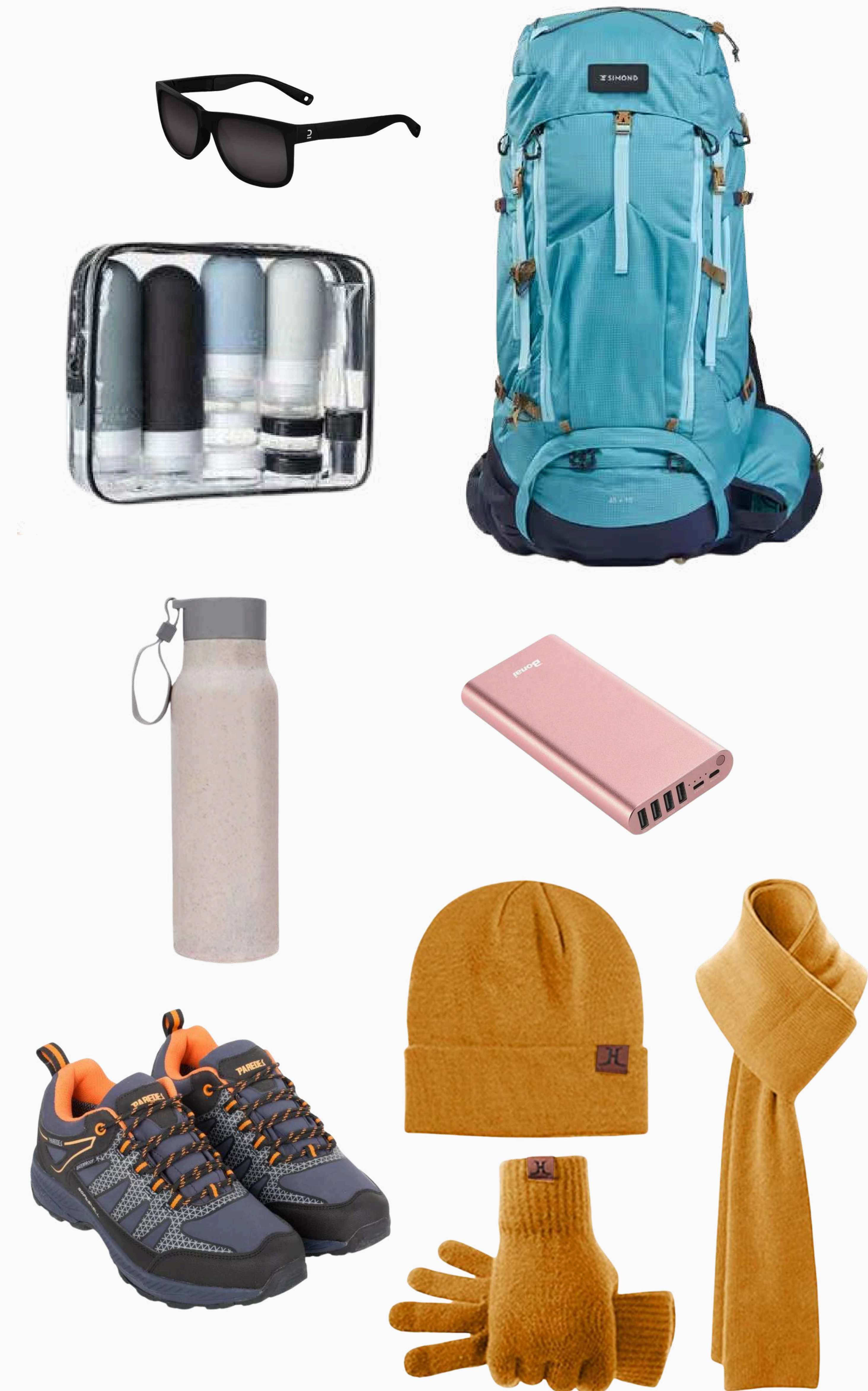


➤ WHERE CAN I STORE MY LUGGAGE DURING THE TOUR?

Most hotels in Cusco offer luggage storage for guests during tours. You can also arrange to leave it with us at the agency if necessary.

WHAT TO BRING?

- **Original passport or ID (required for entrances and identification).**
- Water.
- Sunscreen.
- Cash in small bills (for souvenirs or local purchases).
- Small backpack or sling bag.
- Comfortable sneakers or trainers.
- Warm jacket (it can get cold in the afternoon).
- Hat or cap for sun protection.
- Rain jacket (recommended during the rainy season from November to March).
- Cash in local currency to buy souvenirs.
