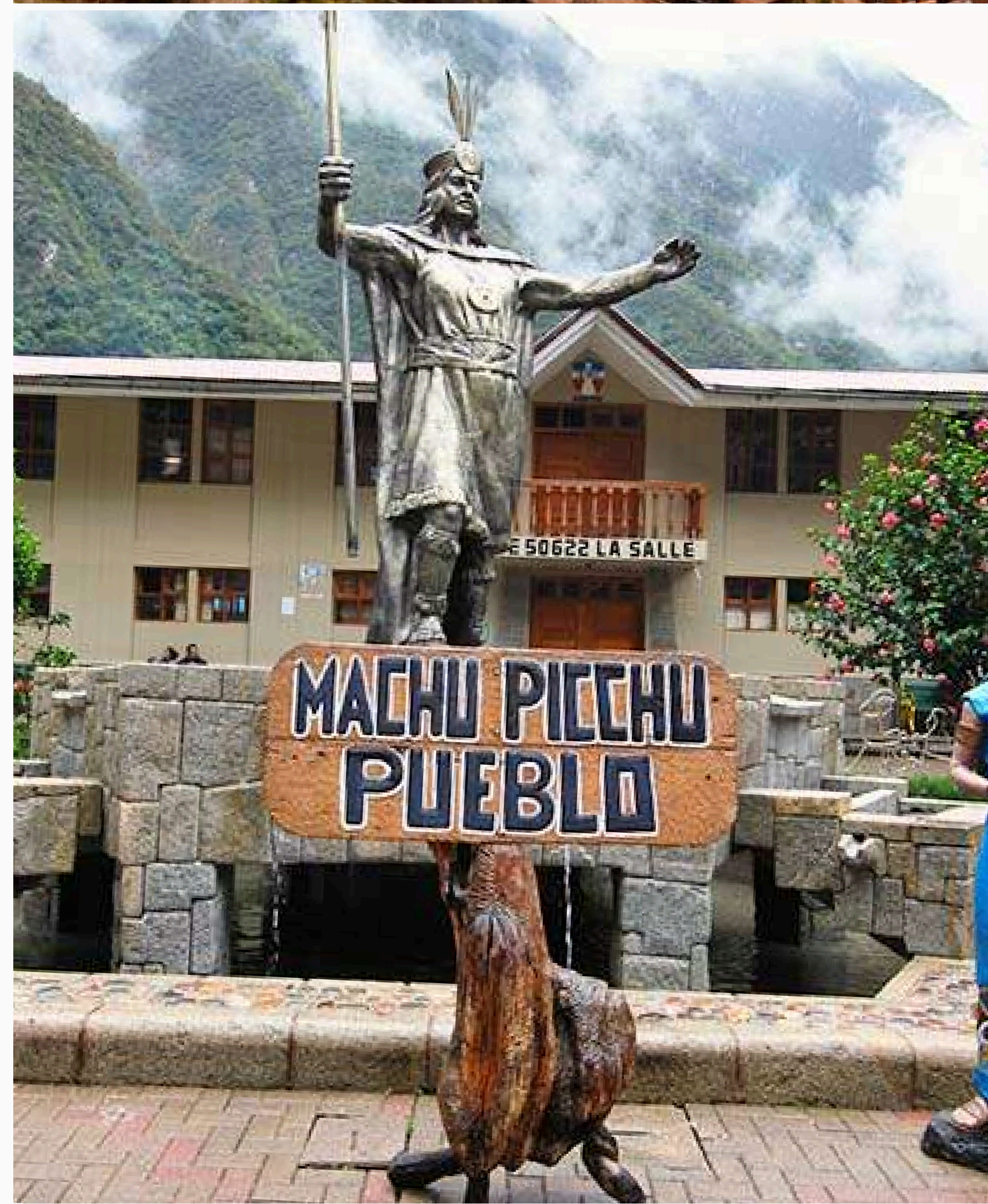
# DAY 01

## SACRED VALLEY – AGUAS CALIENTES

**A cradle of mysteries and wonders, the Sacred Valley defies time and logic.**

Walk the ancestral trails once traveled by Incas is a way to honor the living history of the Andes.

These of the Sacred Valley were not only created to travel long distances, but also to traverse dimensions of wisdom and spirituality. The experience of walking them awakens a sense of profound respect and allows each visitor to feel part of a legacy that lives on in every stone, every step, and every summit reached.





Embark on a journey that blends culture, breathtaking landscapes, and a reconnection with the essentials. From the very beginning, this trip through the Sacred Valley of the Incas invites you to immerse yourself in the living history of the Andes.

Chinchoero will be your first stop; in this cultural town you'll witness the ancestral wisdom of the women weavers who still preserve ancient techniques of natural dyeing and weaving, while the Inca stones and the colonial church envelop you in a story where the past continues to beat. You will visit a textile workshop to see how old weaving ways are still used.

Moray will be the second destination. Visiting the impressive circular terraces of Moray, you'll experience the ingenuity and spirituality with which the Incas worked the land. You will see the round farm terraces carved into the earth.





Nearby, the Maras Salt Mines offer a visual spectacle: thousands of white pools gleaming in the sun, like a gift from the Apus to travelers seeking more than just a photo. Here you will have the opportunity to learn how artisanal salt is made using techniques passed down from generation to generation.

Around lunch time we will stop in Urubamba, in Urubamba you will enjoy an delicious buffet lunch, brimming with authentic flavors that combine local ingredients with Peru's rich gastronomy. It's a perfect time to recharge your energies.

After the delicious lunch, you will visit the Ollantaytambo fortress, this fortress is an emblematic structure that reflects the sophistication of the Inca civilization. Built by the Inca Pachacútec in the 15th century, this fortress served as both a temple and a military bastion. You will feel the history here!



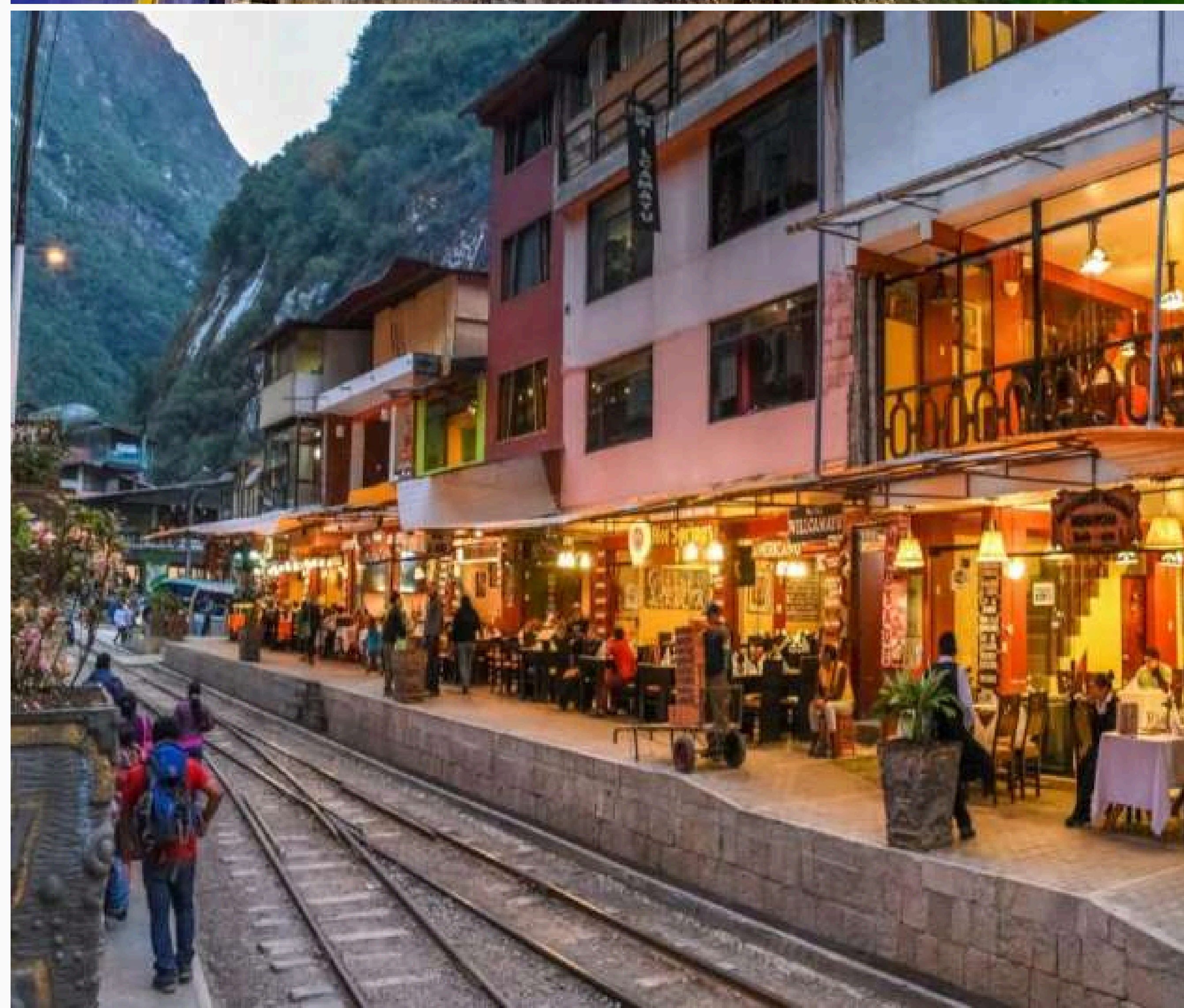


And at the end of the day, the train to Aguas Calientes marks the beginning of a new transformation in this journey.

In Aguas Calientes, you'll take a quick bus ride up to the entrance to Machu Picchu. Get ready for a two-hour guided tour of this amazing old citadel. Our expert guide will awaits for you.





With our expert guide, you will explore its main sectors, including the Temple of the Sun, the Sacred Plaza, the Intihuatana, and the agricultural terraces, while taking in the grandeur of this Andean legacy nestled among the mountains. Machu Picchu is recognized as a World Heritage Site by UNESCO in 1983, Machu Picchu is a symbol of cultural identity, resilience, and ancestral wisdom.

After the guided tour you will have some free time to explore on your own or just enjoy the amazing views and take pictures.

After the visit, you will take the bus back down to Aguas Calientes, where you'll have free time to enjoy lunch at one of its charming restaurants, shop for souvenirs, or simply relax by the river. Later, you will take the train to Ollantaytambo and enjoy landscapes.

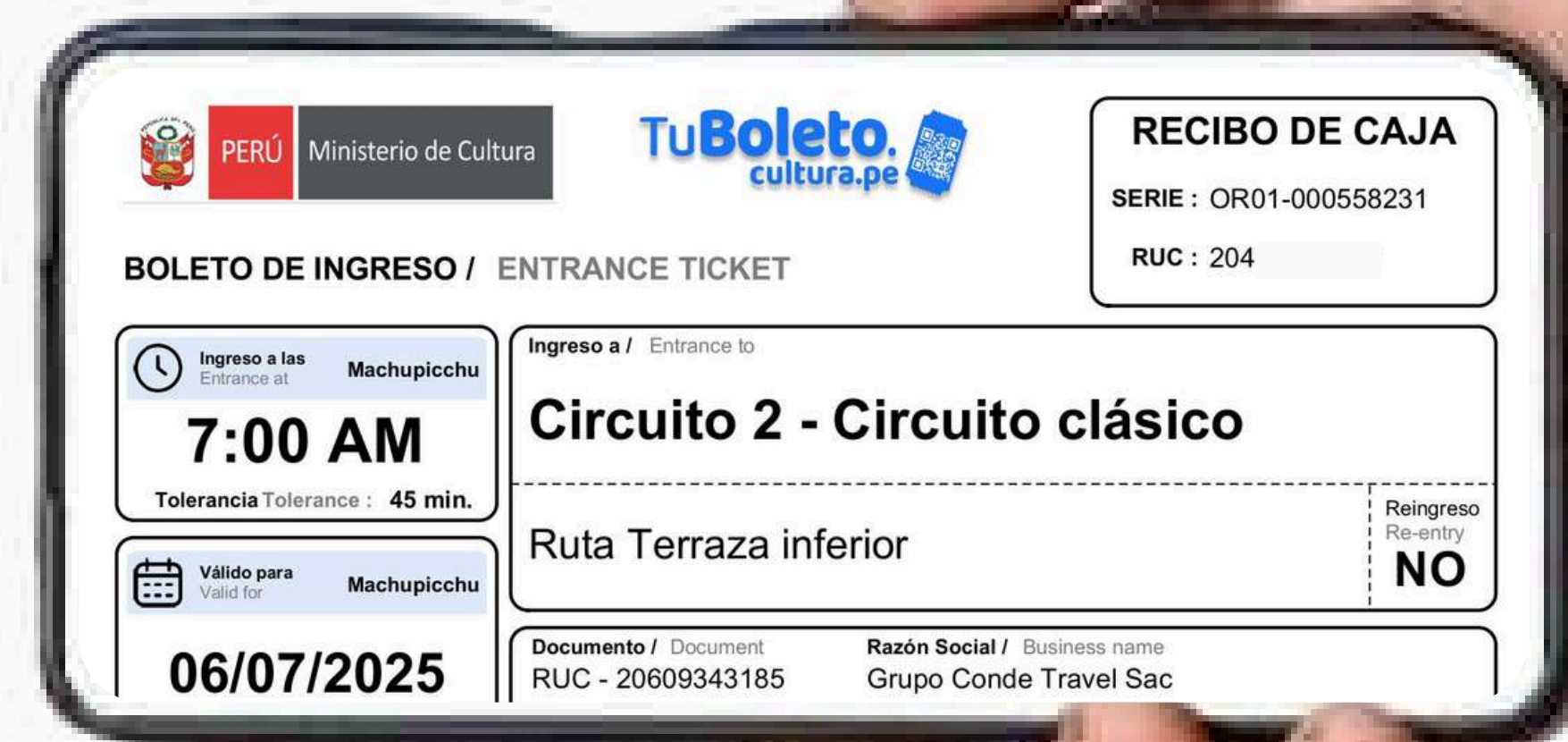

## › **WHAT'S INCLUDED FOR MY VISIT TO MACHU PICCHU?**

Your tour package includes your entrance ticket to Machu Picchu, your round-trip train tickets between Ollantaytambo and Aguas Calientes, a guided tour of approximately 2 hours, and the bus transfers between Aguas Calientes and Machu Picchu. It also covers one night in a comfortable 3-star hotel in Aguas Calientes. After the guided tour, you'll have free time to explore on your own and take photos.

## › **WHAT'S NOT COVERED IN THE PRICE?**

Please note, the following aren't included: meals not specifically mentioned in the itinerary, entrance fees for Huayna Picchu or Machu Picchu Mountain, the optional panoramic train upgrade, hot springs entrance, personal expenses, travel insurance, and tips.

## › **WHAT KIND OF HOTEL IS INCLUDED?**

The tour includes one night in a comfortable 3-star hotel in Aguas Calientes, and breakfast is included with your stay.



## › **CAN I PICK MY TRAIN SCHEDULE?**

We typically book the best available train times to fit your itinerary, ensuring you have plenty of time at Machu Picchu. If you have specific time requests or prefer an upgraded train service (like a panoramic option), please let us know when you book. We can then provide updated prices, as additional costs may apply.



# QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

## ➤ WHAT SHOULD I DO WITH MY LUGGAGE?

We suggest bringing only a small backpack or an overnight bag for this two-day trip. If your hotel in Cusco offers luggage storage, you can leave your main bags safely there. Otherwise, you can securely store them at our office in Cusco during the tour.



## ➤ HOW FAR IN ADVANCE SHOULD I BOOK?

If you're traveling during the high season (April to August), we recommend booking at least 4 months ahead to secure train tickets and Machu Picchu entry. For the rest of the year, 2 to 3 months in advance is typically enough.

## ➤ WHEN'S THE BEST TIME OF YEAR TO GO?

Machu Picchu is open all year. The dry season (May to September) generally offers clearer skies and better weather. During the rainy season (November to March), expect some light rain, clouds, and mist. While this can create a unique, mystical feel, it might occasionally limit visibility.





# WHAT TO BRING?

- **ORIGINAL PHYSICAL PASSPORT (MANDATORY) — Photocopies or digital versions are not accepted.**
- Comfortable walking shoes or sneakers.
- Cash (preferably in small bills) for personal expenses.
- Hat or cap for sun protection.
- Light raincoat or poncho (especially during the rainy season: November to March).
- Sunscreen (essential during the dry season: April to October).
- Plastic bags to protect electronics and personal items.
- Ecological water bottle or canteen.
- Camera, phone, and chargers.
- Insect repellent.
- Personal medications and basic personal care items.
- Change of clothes for the second day.
